Fire Safety

As some of you may know, the year before last the College had a visit from an officer of the West Sussex Fire and Rescue Service, who came to check the fire precautions and procedures required now by law. In many areas our procedures were satisfactory; regular Fire Drills, fire extinguishers etc. However, it was considered that the fire alarm system, although working, didn't meet the latest requirements. Also, we needed emergency lighting and a Fire Safety Risk Assessment. Fortunately, David Heasman, who has always been a loyal supporter of Sackville College and a director of Grinstead Safety Services Ltd, came to the rescue. David and his co-director, Angelo Errigo (an ex-fire brigade Chief Officer) produced an excellent Fire Risk Assessment for the College and helped us choose a company to fit the new alarm system that conformed with the law. Horror of Horrors, it cost the College approximately £20,000! A considerable blow to our funds. The emergency lighting is just about to be fitted at a further cost of around £6.000. We will then fully comply, until the next set of laws.

The Friends' Lunch

The above has been one of the main reasons why we haven't been able to have the Friends' Lunch. We were unable to use the West Room because it didn't comply. The Common Room is usually used as well. However, when the West Room does comply, we will only be able to have 40 people in the room at one time because the staircase down isn't considered wide enough for more people in an emergency. The Friends' Lunch problems will be on the agenda of the next Friends' meeting. We hope that Friends may be able to come up with some solutions. We haven't yet.
