### From the archives

The College has a long history of financial hardship In *The History, Antiquities and Topography of the County of Sussex* by Thomas Walker Horsfield, F.S.A., published by Sussex Press, Lewes in 1835 we find the following:-

From 1637 to about 1684 many suits at law were instituted between the purchasers of such estates, manors, &c. (which had been sold by the said Earl Richard) and the pensioners of the college; such purchasers contending that no understanding, covenant, or provision was given or made in their respective conveyances to render them liable to any proportionate part to be paid by them to the college, either under the will, decree, or otherwise; so that on the hearing of these cases they were decided against the claims of the college, and the sum of 1131. 7s. 3d. thereby extinguished, leaving only 2161. 12s. 9d. for its future support, namely, from the year 1684, or thereabouts, to the present time.

It was subsequently considered that so great a deficiency in the revenue, and dividing the sum of 2161. 12s. 9d. among the original number of persons named in the founder's will was totally inadequate for their maintenance and support; consequently, under the sanction and direction of the former patrons and the present, the numbers have been gradually reduced to the present establishment from 1813, and their pay accordingly augmented with a view of increasing their individual comfort, and to keep them if possible from the assistance of parochial aid. The revenue or rent charge of 2161. 12s. 9d. is the amount received for the support of the college for nearly 150 years, without any diminution, misapplication, or addition whatsoever, and from such persons who from time to time are possessed of the fee of such estates, manors, &c. as were apportioned, and remaining available under the decree.

However it should be noted that the college no longer has any land to generate income!!
