From the Archives

From St Swithun's Parish Magazine April 1873

On 15th April (Easter Tuesday), at three p.m, there was a Choral Service at Sackville College, and the Warden, after welcoming his numerous guests in the Hall, where Dame Knight, aged 91, and Dame Payne, aged 85, strewed bay leaves, bade them partake of the beverage of tea in the west room, which he had lately fitted up. The old character of the decoration was in keeping with the date of the College. There was a buttery fitted up, whence cake and ale were dispensed, reminding one of the cheer of ancient days. Among the company was the late Charles, Earl De La Warr.

The Warden at the time was Dr John Henry Rogers, Warden 1872-79. He was Assistant Warden during the time when John Mason Neale was Warden (1846-66), and had several serious arguments with Neale. However, Dr Rogers bequeathed the Neale Memorial Library to the College. He also continued to hold the Christmas festivities, and gathered supporters of the Sackville Dole and Sustenation Fund. Most of this money was spent on a weekly allowance for meat. Dr Rogers was the founder of the first cottage hospital in East Grinstead. He died suddenly in 1879.

Charles, Earl De La Warr was Major-General Charles Richard Sackville-West, 6th Earl De La Warr KCB (13 November 1815-23 April 1873). He was the second son of George West, 5th Earl De La Warr and Lady Elizabeth Sackville (daughter of John Sackville, 3rd Duke of Dorset, sister of the 4th Duke who died in a hunting accident). He had a sister and 4 brothers. He was educated at Harrow, then served in the British Army. He served in the Crimean War, and was later promoted to the rank of Major-General. He succeeded his father to the earldom in 1869. He was made a Knight Commander of the Order of the Bath (KCB). Lord De La Warr died in April 1873, aged 57. He was unmarried. He was succeeded in the earldom by his younger brother Reginald, Lord Buckhurst.

Lieutenant Harry Sackville Lawson (1876-1918)

Harry Lawson was a grandson of John Mason Neale, but he was born 10 years after Neale's death, at Sackville College, in 1866.

Harry Sackville Lawson was one of 7 children born to the Rev'd Robert Lawson and Mary Sackville Lawson, who was one of the daughters of John Mason Neale.

Lawson married Janet Kathleen Trinder and they had 4 children, 3 boys and a girl. He became Headmaster of Buxton College in 1911.

Harry was commissioned into the 4th North Midland (Howitzer) Brigade RFA as a 2nd Lieutenant on 19th December 1915. Initially he was 'engaged in lecturing', but early in 1917, he volunteered for service at the Front. He was killed in action on 5th February, 1918. Lawrence Housman commented that his sense of duty must have been very strong to take a public school Headmaster into the Army at the age of 41. Lawson wrote 'Letters' of a Headmaster Soldier', published shortly after his death. In the Letters, written to the boys back at Buxton College, he tried to give some impression of his life in the Army, and to inspire the boys with the ideals of citizenship and public spirit.

This account of the loss of a grandson, father, son, brother, headmaster and soldier gives Sackville College a connection of sorts with the First World War.
