At the beginning of April we opened for the East Grinstead Spring Sunday and Bus running day and despite the weather we had 80 visitors and raised over £300.

News from the Warden Sackville College Buildings:

As many Friends will know, the College has recently had a number of structural problems. Firstly, a section of the Common Room ceiling started to sagpurely the ravages of time- and had to be re-fixed and plastered. This has now been done and we are able to use the Common Room again.

The second problem area is the sitting room of Flat 5 (formerly the Almoner's

flat), where a long standing hidden rainwater ingress has been discovered. More investigations are to be carried out, but this will require a certain amount of scaffolding. This will be done immediately after the unveiling of the McIndoe statue, so as not to spoil the look of the College on that occasion.

Lastly, the leopard, who stands on the top of the bell tower, has taken a rather drunken lean to the left. This was caused by the gales of last month and must be investigated to see what has gone wrong.

So, unfortunately, we are having to pass around the begging bowl again. There are two concerts coming up in aid of the repair fund, and we hope that as many Friends as possible will kindly support them. (See details below in this Newsletter).

From the Archives

Sussex Archaeological Collections 13 (1861) pp. 305-306.

'The following account of the Hospitals for the reception of sick and decayed persons in Sussex during the episcopacy of John Lake, who was Bishop of Chichester from **1685-1690**, is taken from the Sancroft papers given to the Bodleian Library by Bishop Tanner. The particular year in which the return was called for and made is not stated'.

'Copy of a return made by the Bishop of Chichester to the Archbishop of Canterbury's enquiries into the number and value of the Hospitals in His Lordship's Diocese.

...In Eastgrinstead is an Hospital or College, founded by Robert, Earle of Dorset, about the year 1608, and endowed with three hundred and thirty pounds per annum, for twenty poore men, whereof one is to be Warden, and ten poor women. But much of the said annual maintenance is withdrawn, and there are now only but twenty-five poore people. The present Chief Patron or Governour is Charles, Earl of Dorset and Middlesex, and Thomas Winterbourn Clerk is Warden.

[Until the year 1616 there was no residence for the pensioners. In that year the present College was built, the expense being defrayed by a legacy of one thousand pounds, bequeathed for the purpose by the Founder. The present income of the College is two hundred and sixteen pounds, twelve shillings, and ninepence.]

... Yours &c &c Jo: Cicestrensis, Edward Turner'.

Note- this account of 1685-90 was published as above, in 1861, by Bishop Ashurst Gilbert Turner, Bishop of Chichester 1842-70, who 'inhibited' John Mason Neale, preventing him from celebrating the Eucharist in the Chapel at Sackville College.

Sackville College and the First World War

This year we are already seeing some commemoration of the events of the Great War and the role played on the Home Front. So far, little can be found about the College at this time. The Warden from 1909-28 was Frank Hill, who had lived in the USA and was married to the pretty lady whose picture hangs in the Common Room on the wall opposite the entrance door. She was American. Warden Hill had three servants and a chauffeur. He died at the College and bequeathed a small legacy to each Resident, to his staff and his chauffeur.

The present Warden remembers that the late Mrs Cheal, a Resident who lived to be 103 years of age, used to sing songs from before the Great War, and songs from that War, songs which her mother had taught her. Another lady, former Resident Mrs Purdey, could remember Zeppelins going over London in the Great War.
